The Andrews Labor Government is leading the way - creating thousands of jobs, driving investment in renewables, cutting the cost of living for families, and working to halve emissions by 2030.

In our 2022/23 Budget we are providing crucial cost of living relief to Victorian families by expanding eligibility for Victoria's nation leading \$1.3 billion Solar Homes program, enabling households to access rebates for both solar panels and solar hot water or high-efficiency electric heat pumps.

This means that 4,500 households in the Mill Park electorate who have previously accessed a rebate to install solar panels can now access up to \$1,000 to install solar hot water or a highly efficient heat pump system.

If you haven't previously claimed a solar rebate, you are eligible for up to \$2,400 in rebates for the installation of bill busting solar products. Households are also eligible for a \$1,400 interest free loan, cutting up to \$3,800 from upfront installation costs.

SOLAR FOR BUSINESSES PROGRAM IS EXPANDING

We are helping even more Victorian businesses to cut their energy bills, with up to \$8,500 off the upfront cost of a solar system installation through the expansion of eligibility criteria of the \$47.5 million **Solar for Business** Program.

More Victorian businesses are now able to take control of their energy bills. Businesses with up to 50 employees can now access a rebate of up to \$3,500 to install solar panels.

For the first time, businesses are also able to apply for zero interest loans of between \$1,000 and \$5,000 to reduce the initial outlay for solar installation.

BETTER HEALTH SERVICES FOR ALL FIRST-CLASS CARE & 5,000 EXTRA NURSES



As part of the Andrews Labor Government 2022/23 Budget we will invest over \$12 billion to deliver better hospitals, first-class care and recruit and train 5,000 extra nurses and 2.000 other healthcare workers to ease the pressures on our current healthcare workforce.

That means faster and better care when you need it. Our local Northern Hospital will get more staff and additional bed capacity to alleviate the current demand.

NEW ACUTE MENTAL HEALTH FACILITY IN EPPING

The Andrews Labor Government is delivering a new 30 beds acute mental health facility at the Northern Hospital, Epping. This new facility will increase capacity and reduce pressure on the emergency department of the Northern Hospital and has been co-designed with people who have lived and experienced Victoria's mental health system.

The facility is part of our \$492 million Mental health beds expansion program which is in response to a key recommendation of the Royal Commission into Victoria's Mental Health System.

It will also provide extra support for people experiencing mental illness who need immediate treatment.

MORE PARAMEDICS & A NEW AMBULANCE STATION IN EPPING

We know that demand for emergency services is at an all-time high, that's why we're delivering another 90 paramedics to meet the current demand. Additionally, we are investing \$333 million for 400 new staff to increase Triple Zero call-taking and dispatch capacity, and additional training for operators.

We are getting on with boosting ambulance resources in Epping, giving paramedics the facilities and support they need to quickly respond to local emergencies by constructing a new ambulance branch on McDonald's Road, Epping.

The new 24-hour, two-storey ambulance branch will feature a five-bay garage for ambulances, six rest and recline areas for our hard-working paramedics to recuperate, training facilities, a fully equipped kitchen and improved security and car parking to make sure paramedics are safe.

The project involves knocking down and rebuilding the existing ambulance branch on McDonald's Road to provide new, modern amenities.



EDUCATION BETTER FACILITIES & SUPPORT FOR MILL PARK STUDENTS

Students with disabilities and special needs are entitled to exactly the same opportunities as every other student in Victoria.

That's why in our government's 2022/23 budget we are investing \$326 million to deliver upgrades for 36 special schools including for our local Merriang Special Developmental School. Both campuses of the Merriang Special Developmental School in South Morang and Lalor will receive \$5.32 million to deliver the final stage of the school's master plan, providing better facilities for all the students.

ROADS CHILDS ROAD UPGRADE: ALMOST DONE!

Motorists in Mill Park are getting a taste of how the Childs Road Upgrade is creating safer and less congested journeys, with the new bridge across Darebin Creek now open.

Following the completed works at Bowman Drive works will continue on upgrading the existing bridge and the northern carriageway plus building the new underpass trail. In the coming months we'll start the construction of the new rest area near the bridge.

As part of the Darebin Creek Lookout, there has been community input into the new Indigenous artwork for the Rest area along with community selecting the Red Ironbark and native trees to be planted in the area. To foster better connections between people and places, the Wurundjeri Elders, the Darebin Creek Management Committee and Lalor North Secondary College collaborate through workshops with the secondary school students about cultural heritage and the environment of Darebin Creek.

The **Childs Road Upgrade** is on track for completion in 2023. The project is part of the Andrews Labor Government \$2.2 billion investment in Suburban Roads Upgrades.

BETTER ACCESS TO FARM VIGANO FOR ALL TO ENJOY!

Farm Vigano is an important historical site for our local community. As the Minister for Energy, the Environment and Climate Change I am thrilled to announce that in the 2022/23 Budget we are investing \$400,000 to improve access to the public areas of Farm Vigano.

We will be working with Heritage Victoria to deliver new accessible walking paths, viewing platforms, and access to the wetlands and ensure that Farm Vigano becomes a well-utilised place for the local community and residents





EPPING ROAD ON THE GO

The contract to construct the Epping Rd upgrade is about to be awarded and this long-awaited road upgrade is getting underway soon.

Early works, including utility relocations, are expected on the ground in the coming months, with major construction commencing thereafter.

The Epping Road Upgrade will add extra lanes between Craigieburn Road East and Memorial Avenue, install new traffic lights at Park Street, upgrade intersections and build better walking and cycling connections.

PARKS & RECREATION PLENTY RIVER TRAIL ON ITS WAY

We are building the new 19km Plenty River Trail. The final designs have now been released after extensive consultation with the Wurundjeri Woi Wurrung Traditional Owners and our local community.

The Plenty River Trail will go through the Plenty Gorge linking University Hill Bundoora -through Mill Park and South Morang- to Doreen.

Five stunning new lookouts, two new bridges, new picnic and barbecue facilities at the Hawkstowe Picnic Area and Nioka Bush Camp and the Plenty River Trail itself are on the way.

This new multiuse trail will be accessible to runners, walkers, cyclists with a large portion of it suitable for all abilities including prams and wheelchairs.



This \$20.4m project is funded as part of our Government's \$315 million Suburban Parks Program.

SKILLS & EMPLOYMENT MORE JOBS, MORE OPPORTUNITIES

A job is about more than just a pay cheque – it means being able to provide for your family and plan for the future and in our 2022/23 Budget we're helping Victorians find the fair and decent jobs they deserve.

When the pandemic hit our state, we responded with record investment to protect Victorian lives and livelihoods. We had a plan to create **400,000 jobs by 2025**, with a target to deliver half of them by 2022. Victoria has already far exceeded our goal – with employment rising by 280,000 since September 2020. We are well on track to reach our target of 400,000 jobs by 2025.

FREE TAFE
